The QS Reimagine Education Awards celebrate the innovators reshaping global education and preparing learners for the challenges of tomorrow. These awards bring together a community of educators, institutions, and edtech startups committed to transforming how we learn and work.

For 2026, we've introduced a series of considered refinements to our categories and questions. These updates ensure the awards remain relevant as education continues to evolve, while helping applicants clearly showcase the impact and distinctiveness of their work.

With 15 diverse categories, we recognise and reward pioneering programmes, cutting-edge technologies, and forward-thinking teaching methods that are changing the face of education. Each year, more than 1,600 entries are reviewed through a rigorous process by a panel of over 1,300 international experts, ensuring the highest standards of excellence.

These awards honour the efforts of those driving progress in education, celebrating innovative solutions that inspire collaboration and improve learning outcomes worldwide.

Prize highlights

The Global Education Award winner receives a \$25,000 USD prize to support the expansion and impact of their groundbreaking work.

The Global EdTech Award winner is granted \$25,000 USD in Cloud credits, offering access to advanced digital tools to enhance and scale their solutions.

By recognising and supporting these trailblazers, the awards aim to spark new ideas, foster partnerships, and encourage excellence in education.

Join us in celebrating the visionaries shaping the future of learning. Together, we can embrace innovation, share knowledge, and create opportunities for learners everywhere.

31 July 2026, 23:59 BST.



How to apply & key dates

The call for submissions is now open, with the application window running until **Friday 31 July 2026**.

Our application form allows you to start your submission, save your progress, and return later to complete it.

Before beginning your application, identify the category that best suits your project. You can find the full list of categories on the next pages and at www.reimagine-education/apply.

Once you've chosen a category, you'll need to select one of four pathways:

Academic (Early-stage)

Academic (Mature)

Enterprise (Early-stage)

Enterprise (Mature)

These pathways apply to all categories except **'AI Innovation in Education'** which has two pathways Academic or Enterprise, while **'Innovation in Business Education'**, **'The Power of Partnerships'** and **'Sustainability Education'** **have only one pathway**. You can learn more about the pathways in the following pages.

The application process is free for all participants, reflecting our commitment to making the awards accessible to those advancing meaningful innovation across education.

Winners will be announced live at the in-person conference taking place at the InterContinental London – The O2, **7–8 December 2026**.

Attendance at the conference is not required to qualify, but we strongly encourage it as a valuable opportunity to connect, collaborate, and celebrate innovation in education.

The judging process

When you apply for the Reimagine Education Awards, you'll need to complete sections explaining your project. These will be reviewed by our panel of judges and evaluated against specific criteria.

The exact sections and their importance will depend on:

1. The stage of development your project has reached.
2. Whether your project is classified as 'Academic' or 'Enterprise' (explained below).
3. Whether your application is for one of the four award categories with a single pathway:
Innovation in Business Education, The Power of Partnerships, Sustainability Education Action, or Literacy Awards.

Our judging process ensures early-stage projects are assessed fairly, without being compared to mature academic programmes or global tech companies.

Academic Pathway

For projects led by: Higher Education Institutions, Research Institutes, Primary/ Secondary Schools, or Education Authorities.

Enterprise Pathway

For projects led by EdTech companies, corporations, associations/foundations, or NGOs/NPOs.

Early stage

Choose this option if your project is in pilot, early rollout, or initial implementation phases.

Typically:

- The project has been in development or operation for less than 3 years.
- It may be operating within a limited cohort, institution, or context.
- Evidence of impact is emerging or still being gathered.
- Future outcomes and growth are supported by a clear plan for measurement and evaluation.

There is no advantage to selecting one stage over the other. Projects are assessed relative to their chosen stage.

Mature

Choose this option if your project has progressed beyond initial pilots and demonstrated sustained outcomes.

Typically:

- The project has been in development or operation for more than 3 years.
- It has been implemented across multiple cohorts, contexts, or settings.
- There is clear evidence of impact over time.
- The approach has been shown to be repeatable or sustainable.

Timeframes are indicative only. Please select the stage that most accurately reflects the current maturity of your initiative.





It's important to note that the four pathways are not award categories. For example, you won't apply for an 'Academic (Early-stage) Award'. Instead, the pathways define the criteria judges will use to evaluate your project, ensuring fair comparisons.

The QS Reimagine Education Awards focus on three key areas:

- 1. Innovation:** What makes your project stand out, and how does it compare to others?
- 2. Impact or potential impact:** How does your project solve a problem, who benefits from it, and how does it improve learning outcomes and employability?
- 3. Depth or scalability:** Choose depth if the goal is to deepen impact or enhance quality, or scalability if the aim is to grow and expand.

You can upload or link to supporting evidence after completing each relevant section of the form.

You'll also need to submit a **two-minute video pitch or demonstration** of your project. While the video isn't scored, it can strengthen your application.

Keep the video under **two minutes**.

Upload it to YouTube and add the link in the application form.

Future of Learning

AI Innovation in Education

Have you developed original AI that enables measurable educational impact? Explain what you built, why it was needed, and how outcomes go beyond third-party tools.

Immersive Experiential Learning

Does your immersive experiential project create authentic, high-impact learning? Share how experiential design deepens understanding and skills, and evidence that impact goes beyond novelty.

Learning Assessment

Have you developed a project that rethinks how learners are evaluated? Explain how your approach improves the measurement of understanding, skills, and learning outcomes.

Learning Design Excellence

Have you innovated in pedagogy or curriculum design to improve learner experience? Describe your design choices and evidence of engagement, accessibility, and meaningful learning outcomes.

Neuroscience for Learning

Is your project grounded in neuroscience to improve learning? Describe how research informed your design and the measurable changes in teaching practice or learner outcomes.

Future of Universities

Innovation in Business Education

Are you transforming business education through discipline-specific change? Explain how your initiative reshapes curriculum or practice and demonstrates impact beyond a single module.

The Power of Partnerships

Does your project focus on partnerships as the main driver of impact? Describe who you collaborated with, how it worked, and what outcomes were achieved through the partnership.

Future of Work

Developing Emerging Skills and Competencies

Is your project equipping learners with future-ready skills? Highlight how you build technical and transferable capabilities, such as AI, data skills, creativity, and adaptability.

Lifelong Learning

Have you developed structured pathways for sustained upskilling or reskilling? Explain how learners progress over time through modular or flexible learning beyond one-off skills.

Nurturing Employability

Are you fostering employability with measurable career outcomes? Describe how your initiative improves work readiness, connects learners to opportunities, and supports successful transitions into employment.

Sustainability

Sustainability Education Action

Does your project translate sustainability principles into measurable real-world action? Explain the environmental or social outcomes achieved and how the initiative drives impact beyond awareness.

Sustainability Education Literacy

Are you fostering sustainability literacy through structured curriculum and interdisciplinary content? Describe how you build systems thinking and understanding across environmental, social, and economic dimensions.



Values

Access, Diversity and Inclusion

Does your project focus on removing barriers to access and inclusion? Explain the context, who benefits, and measurable improvements in participation and achievement.

Nurturing Values and Ethics

Have you developed initiatives that build values and ethical decision-making? Explain how integrity, empathy, or ethics are embedded in learning and what changes you can evidence.

Nurturing Wellbeing and Purpose

Are you fostering wellbeing and purpose in your learning community? Describe the support provided and evidence of improved mental, physical, or emotional outcomes for learners.
