The Autumn School 2025 welcomes participants from diverse academic and professional backgrounds who share a commitment to the protection and empowerment of children affected by armed conflict.

It is open to:

- Young professionals and practitioners working in human rights, humanitarian aid, peacebuilding, development cooperation, or child protection sectors.

CONTENT OF THE COURSE

The Autumn School adopts an interdisciplinary and participatory approach, drawing on law, sociology, anthropology, psychology, and international relations.

The thematic areas include:

- Psychosocial and trauma-informed approaches, with attention to recovery, resilience, and community support systems;
- **⊗** Education, vocational training, and livelihood strategies as essential tools for *reintegration*;
- Transitional justice and accountability mechanisms to address violations and restore dignity;
- ✓ Gender and identity in reintegration, with a focus on the distinct challenges faced by girls and young women, including stigma and social exclusion;
- Community-based reconciliation and social cohesion, highlighting the role of local actors, youth organisations, and civil society in building inclusive peace.



STRUCTURE OF THE COURSE

The Autumn School 2025 unfolds across two complementary weeks, blending youth engagement with academic expertise.

- ✓ Week One Youth Perspectives Week
 Led by YouthNet Mediators for Peace and Security, this week
 empowers young leaders to design and facilitate discussions,
 workshops, and reflections on the reintegration of children
 affected by conflict, guided by mentors from the Network.
- Week Two Academic & Expert Week

 Lectures, panels, and interactive sessions led by professors and international practitioners explore legal, psychosocial, educational, and policy dimensions of reintegration, with a strong focus on gender-sensitive approaches and community-based recovery.
- The course combines expert-led lectures, workshops, and simulations with a Pre-Course Reading Pack, recorded sessions, and a digital networking platform for global collaboration.



ABOUT THE COURSE

The Autumn School 2025, "Rebirth: Empowerment and Rehabilitation of Children in Armed Conflict, with a Focus on Girls" marks the 5th Edition of a global learning initiative promoted by the Universities Network for Children in Armed Conflict (UNETCHAC) and supported by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation (MAECI).

This year's edition explores the theme of Reintegration, a process that embraces the emotional, social, and educational dimensions of rebuilding a life after war. Reintegration is a journey of dignity, healing, and empowerment. For girls, it also means confronting unique challenges such as stigma, gender-based violence, and interrupted education, and transforming them into spaces of resilience and strength.
