Hipóteses evolucionistas sobre sexo e parentesco

1. Ementa da disciplina:

O projeto de pesquisa "Críticas filosóficas do casamento" propõe a caracterização do casamento como uma técnica de coordenação para resolver problemas sociais recorrentes. Esta definição funcional está inserida no paradigma da "moralidade como cooperação", um desenvolvimento recente nas áreas da Antropologia e da Psicologia Moral.

A disciplina **Hipóteses evolucionistas sobre sexo e parentesco** fará a apresentação e discussão de desenvolvimentos conceituais do campo evolucionista, na Antropologia e na Psicologia, que impactam a compreensão da instituição política do casamento.

- c) parentalidade;
- d) patriarcado;
- e) seleção sexual;
- f) estruturas de parentesco;
- g) feminismos e antropologia evolucionista.

2. Metodologia:

Leitura, análise e discussão dos textos indicados na Bibliografia.

A avaliação na disciplina será feita por duas notas:

- a) Produção de um ensaio, entre 3.000 e 3.500 palavras, sobre temas relacionados aos tópicos centrais listados no programa da disciplina (70% da nota);
- b) Apresentação (individual ou em grupo) de texto listado na bibliografia da disciplina e participação ativa nos seminários de leitura orientada (30% da nota).
